Dear Applicant,

An Income Tax repayment is a refund of tax that you've overpaid.  
Internal Revenue Service ( IRS ) has received new information about your taxable income you've overpaid too much tax through your job or pension in previous years.

There was a mistake with your tax, which an error occurred on your tax return, and therefore your income reduced. Your employer also used the wrong tax code.

You are eligible to receive a refund of **\$2670.48 USD** as your recent tax refund.  
IRS will send you a repayment. You'll get the repayment either by cheque in the post or by bank transfer.

Note : Your refund can be delayed for a variety of reasons. For example submitting invalid records or applying after the deadline.
